Background

The Western Trust is committed to its reporting and monitoring obligations in accordance with the Rural Needs Act (NI) (2016). The Trust has carried out the following activity to comply with and mainstream the duties:

- Trust staff continue to liaise with Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Issues staff regarding training, information and advice for staff.
- Advice and guidance is available within the Trust for staff completing rural needs assessments.

The Trust is committed to promoting and upholding its duties in relation to the Rural Needs Act (NI) 2016 and will have due regard to rural needs in the development of all our policy and public service delivery decisions. The Trust is mindful that the level of 'regard' due will depend on the circumstances and, in particular, on the relevance of rural needs to the decision or function in question. The greater the relevance and potential impact for people in rural needs, the greater the regard required by the duty. In the table below, the Trust has provided detail on those policies which were considered as having a bearing on rural needs and therefore subject to a rural needs assessment. In preparing this monitoring template the Trust considered policies in respect of the social and economic needs of persons in rural areas and for the majority, no rural needs were identified. Many of these policies are clinical or technical in nature and have no bearing on rural needs.

Introduction of Regional Automatic Number Plate Recognition Car Parking Management Solution to Hospital sites	Health and Social Care	Service Users living in rural areas may be encouraged by this legislation to drive private cars to appointments as transport can present an issue for people living in rural areas, especially the elderly and disabled people due to geographical isolation, e.g. people living in rural areas may have to travel further to access public transport, there can sometimes be a lack of public transport, and timing of public transport may be an issue. Adding to the additional cost of living for people in rural areas with extra fuel/transport costs. Lack of internet availability/quality can be an issue in rural areas which can bring issues to staff and Service Users when booking a space online although tablets will be available onsite for this purpose. Statistics published on Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Issues website show that 93% and 99% of rural and urban areas respectively had coverage of superfast broadband in 2023. The Trust commits to monitoring for any potential adverse impact on our Service Users.
Reconfiguration of Rossneal Home Site as 6x bedded Children's Home	Health and Social Care	Distance between Chapel Road and the Rossneal site is 2.2 miles. This will have minor impact on staff with additional time or costs with travelling to work. Service Users will be further away from the L'Derry city centre however impact will be minor. Any rurality issues have been considered in accordance with child care planning
